

COVID-19 UPDATE

On March 25, 2020 the County Commission voted to adopt a “Stay at Home Order” as a measure intended to further limit the spread of this contagious disease.

Residents are ordered to remain in place at their homes except for essential activities, essential business and essential government functions. Generally, this includes:

- Tasks essential to maintain health and safety, such as obtaining medicine or seeing a doctor.
- Getting necessary services or supplies for themselves or their family or household members, such as food and supplies, pet food and supplies necessary for staying at home.
- Caring for a family member in another household or caring for elderly, minors, dependents, people with disabilities or other vulnerable persons.
- Engaging in outdoor activity, such as walking or running provided that they maintain at least 6 feet of social distancing.

This Order is effective beginning at 12:01 Am on March 26, 2020 and will continue for 30 days unless it is renewed or withdrawn

On March 19, 2020 the Christian County Commission signed an order amending their existing Declaration a State of Emergency Due to Coronavirus. The Order places a prohibition on public gatherings of 10 or more people and makes it unlawful for anyone to organize or attend gatherings exceeding that size. This does not apply to educational institutions, daycare facilities, places of employment, grocery stores, retail stores, municipal facilities, or other activities which cannot constitutionally be closed.

Currently, all County offices remain open but the Commission asks that citizens avoid visiting in person if the matter at hand can be accomplished via telephone or email.
